





Cultural Dimensions



Power Distance Index (PDI)

Panama **Ecuador** Japan **USA** New Zealand

- High Power Distance (Hierarchical)
 - o Enforce/follow guidelines
 - Appropriate behavior for different roles
 - Status and position respected
 - o Protocol more important
 - Power and authority are centralized
 - Importance of the chain of command

- Low Power Distance (Egalitarian)
 - o Self-directed
 - o Flexibility in roles
 - Okay to challenge people in power
 - o Informal
 - Organizational structure aims to encourage autonomy and responsibility

Individualism (IDV)

USA New Zealand

Panama **Ecuador**

- Individualism
 - Identity from achievements
 - o Challenge hierarchy
 - Competitive amongst peers
 - Decisions based on individual goals

- Collectivism
 - Identity from network
 - o Maintain hierarchy
 - o Prefer team environment
 - Decisions based on group goals
 - o "Face" considerations
