

Summer 2011 Fellowship Opening with The Advocacy Project

Work for 10-12 weeks (June-August, 2011) full-time as a Peace Fellow with [The Advocacy Project](#), for their partner organization, [Democracy and Workers Rights Center](#) (DWRC) in Ramallah, Palestine.

To respond to the needs of the Palestinian society, DWRC was established by a group of lawyers, academics, trade unionists and prominent figures in the Palestinian society to defend Palestinian workers' rights and promote principles of democracy and social justice in the Palestinian territories.

The Advocacy Project has partnered with Democracy and Workers Rights Center (DWRC) in Ramallah, Palestine to work with a fellow who will profile members of the Federation of Independent Unions, help them build IT skills and strengthen their website, as well as support a new network of independent unionists as they lobby for the protection of labor rights.

The applicant must speak fluent Arabic, be a graduate student of Conflict Resolution, Human Rights, Development, and/or other related specializations and be able to attend a 3-day training in Washington, DC, from May 23rd-25th, 2011.

The Peace Fellow will also be expected to complete the following duties while in the field. Duties include, but are not limited to:

- Posting a regular blog (atleast 10 blogs for a 3-month fellowship)
- Helping the DWRC to blog
- Helping to maintain the website for DWRC
- Working on a partner page for DWRC, to be posted on the AP site
- Organizing a photo library for your host on Flickr
- Helping DWRC use Google Analytics and Skype
- Putting up a Facebook page (or the regional equivalent) for your host
- Helping your host to use Twitter
- Take and edit video footage
- Provide material for an AP press release
- Identify and work shoulder to shoulder with 'accidental techie'

This fellowship is unpaid, however fundraising opportunities are available, and a small stipend available on a *financial need basis*.
