Understanding the China Dream Practicum




Purpose

The China Dream was thought up recently as a means of charting China's success and giving the country broad goals for what that success entails. Much like the American Dream it can mean something different for everyone you meet.


What we came to understand is that the people we asked all had similarities and differences depending on their current state in life.
